Greetings in the name of the Risen Christ!

John Wesley was almost in despair. He did not have the faith to continue to preach.

When death stared him in the face, he was fearful and found little comfort in his religion. To Peter Böhler, a Moravian friend, he confessed his growing misery and decision to give up the ministry. Böhler counseled otherwise. "Preach faith till you have it," he advised. "And then because you have it, you will preach faith."

On May 24th, 1738 he opened his Bible at about five in the morning and came across these words, "There are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises, even that ye should partakers of the divine nature." He read similar words in other places. That evening he reluctantly attended a meeting in Aldersgate. Someone read from Luther's Preface to the Epistle to Romans. About 8:45 PM "while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that Christ had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

After this experience Wesley became bold in his witness. He began traveling all around England preaching and serving the people of God. His preaching became so controversial that he was barred from preaching in the pulpits of the Church of England. Since he continued to preach in the open fields, he was charged with "trespassing" on the parishes of other ministers.

He replied to this charge in a letter written in March of 1739 with what has become the most famous quote of Wesley, "the world is my parish." In the letter he says, "I look upon all the world as my parish; thus far I mean, that in whatever part of it I am, I judge it meet, right and my bounden duty to declare, unto all that are willing to hear, the glad tidings of salvation. This is the work which I know God has called me to; and sure I am that His blessing attends it. Great encouragement have I, therefore, to be faithful in fulfilling the work He hath given me to do. His servant I am, and, as such, am

employed according to the plain direction of His Word, 'As I have opportunity, doing good unto all men'; and His providence clearly concurs with his Word; which has disengaged me from all things else, that I might singly attend on this very thing, 'and go about doing good.'"

Wesley's ministry knew no boundaries. There was no place he could not and would not go to be in ministry to God's people. As time went on, John Wesley was used powerfully by our Lord to reform England. The movement he began with his brother Charles, and others, became a national force. John rode thousands of miles (as many as 20,000 a year) preaching as only a man filled with the Holy Spirit can preach, telling the gospel to all who would listen. He acted "as though he were out of breath in pursuit of souls." Wherever he preached, he also provided care in the way of establishing classes which provided for the basic needs of the people. Read here that food, clothes, and housing were provided for those in need. Lives changed and manners and morals altered for the better. It is often conjectured that his preaching helped spare England the kind of revolution that occurred in France.

So why do we establish boundaries? There are many things that sometimes discourage a Pastor in her ministry, but the one that cuts my heart to the quick is when I hear the people say when asked to engage in mission activity or service projects: "Why? That doesn't affect us," or "we need to take care of our own," or "that is Kankakee's problem, not ours." Whether the mission, ministry or act of service is to an individual living in Kankakee, Bradley, Bourbonnais, or Bonfield, Illinois, the United States or Timbukto, the mission, ministry or act of service is done in the name of Jesus the Christ.

When we are reluctant to reach out to our brothers and sisters in other areas of our world there are usually reasons. First, we may be worried that there isn't going to be enough left of whatever "it" is to care for ourselves. Secondly, we may be saying we don't believe that God is calling us to this particular ministry nor that God will provide what is needed to accomplish HIS ministry. Third, we may be saying

that our hearts are simply too small for all that God is calling us to do and to be.

When "we" become our primary focus of ministry then "we" have failed to be an obedient church filled with obedient people to God's ministry.




Ladies' Book Club

Committees/Teams Information Article

THE TRUSTEES – THEIR ROLE

As a trustee, you will supervise and maintain all property belonging to your congregation so that the ministries of the congregation can be effective. The trustees have several legal and administrative functions. They are to:

- oversee, maintain, and supervise all local church property;
- report annually to the charge conference the state of the church's property, equipment, investments, and resources:
- receive and administer all gifts (bequests, gifts or trusts) made to the congregation;
- make certain that all trust funds of the congregation are properly invested;
- ensure that the articles of incorporation of the congregation are keep up to date, if applicable;
- be response, in conjunction with the pastor, for all use of the church buildings and grounds;
- maintain adequate insurance coverage on all church property and develop appropriate risk management policies;
- submit to the committee on finance the annual budget requests for insurance, property maintenance and improvements, and new property purchases;
- be accountable to the charge conference and the church council &
- oversight of custodial staff; but not the hiring as Staff Pastor Parish Relations is responsible for all hiring of employees.


THE FINANCE COMMITTEE - THEIR ROLE

The finance committee is charged with all of the following activities:

- oversee stewardship;
- compile a budget annually;
- raise sufficient income to meet the budget
- administer funds received by the church;
- count and deposit the offering;
- disburse funds;
- establish internal control policies
- review and report annually on the adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls,
- provide for an annual audit of the church financial statements.
- report to the annual charge conference on the audit,
- recommend proper depositories for church funds, use contributions in accordance with donors' intent.
- report annually to the church council all designated funds that are separate from the church budget.

Members of finance are: chair, pastor, lay member of the annual conference, chair of church council, chair of SPPRC, representative of trustees, lay leader, financial secretary, treasurer, others as determined by charge conference. The pastor and any other individual that is paid is without a vote.
