Sometimes the plans we make can be changed in a moment's notice. Last month in this article I talked about the Advent series I was going to preach, along with other items related to the Advent season. Early in the afternoon on November 23rd, those plans were quickly changed.

That morning I woke up feeling much like I had been for two weeks or so prior. Over that stretch of time, I had been noticing that the weight loss I achieved through most of 2021 going in the wrong direction. And this gain was affecting my ability to breath, especially when walking for any distance. Also, I could hear fluid moving around in my body, something I felt in the beginning of last year prior to starting my change in what I was eating. November 23rd, I saw a gain of 4 lbs. in 48 hours, and in my head I knew something needed to be done. So, I went to get answers on how to get rid of the excess fluid.

What happened as the day went on was finding out the reason for the issues I was having were triggered by a very low heart rate. So around 5 pm that day I found myself lying on an operating table as my new (to me) cardiologist was preparing to install a pacemaker in my upper chest. The plans I had for Advent were changed instantly. Instead of researching material I had a flurry of calls made, some by me and some by my best friend, to have the first Sunday of Advent covered for me. Two weeks of recovery suddenly were in front of me.

First, I have to thank God for pushing me to get things checked out. I've been told, after the most recent follow up with my cardiologist, that had I not done something there is a good chance I would not be here today. Next I have to thank the team of professionals that took care of me while in the hospital and are still keeping an eye on me. But I would be remiss if I didn't thank EVERYONE in this Parish who prayed for me, sent me get well cards, filled in for me on two Sundays and so much more. Thanks to Ken Miller for sharing the message on November 28th and Dianne Wells for sharing the message on December 5th.

I shared on December 12th how I am Blessed to be given a second chance by God after this health scare. As this is the article for the first month of 2022, I would like to give everyone reading this something to think about. Instead of thinking up resolutions that eventually are broken, how about this year taking a few moments to say a simple prayer to God. Ask Him to help give you a second chance if you need one. It doesn't need to be as drastic as what I went through in November. It can be something very simple. Think about making the beginning of this year the reason to come back to church if you have strayed away. Think about making this year the reason you take time out to reach out to friends and family you haven't seen or talked to for far to long and miss. Thing about making this year the time you remember daily that we are only guaranteed one day at a time here on Earth and to do your best to make each day count! That is my plan for this year, will you join me?

## So help me God

## What's in a name?

As the U.S. evacuated thousands from Afghanistan in August 2021, an Afghan woman gave birth on a plane. She named her daughter Reach — the name of the aircraft that brought her family to safety.

Many people name their children after loved ones or special events; a child born on Christmas might be called Noel or Holly. In Bible times, too, names often had meanings: Eve likely means "mother of all living"; Abraham, "father of many"; Isaac, "laughter." Moses is a play on words with the Hebrew for "draw out" because Pharaoh's daughter drew him from the Nile.

Of course, the most important biblical name is Jesus, which means "The Lord saves." As the angel told Joseph, "[Mary] will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21, ESV). The Christian church traditionally celebrates Name of Jesus on January 1. But every day, as we pray in Jesus' name, we remember that what's in *this* name is the salvation God offers to all.




