Is it just me, or is this year moving very quickly? This newsletter will get us to ¼ of the newsletters for 2022.

Before I look ahead, let's remember how things were two years ago this month. News had already told us about a virus that was in the US, but it was March 2020 when, among many other places, our churches had to stop in-person services

due to the unknown. A lot of people stayed home; roadways were very quiet (I remember driving to the Loop with no traffic stoppages at all).

At the time I am writing this, I can share with you that we are taking another step to whatever normal can be as the County West Wednesday Lenten services will resume this month! We are trying to get the complete information on which church is having a service on what date and who is providing the message. Look inside the newsletter to see if we have the information.

I can tell you that there will be an Ash Wednesday service on March 2nd, 7pm at Reddick UMC. In addition to this service, I will have ashes available inside the north entrance of Evan (just like last year) for anyone who will not be attending the worship service that night. This will be available from 1-5pm on March 2nd and will provide instructions along with ashes to self-impose in containers.

A Lenten Bible study will begin on Monday March 7th for six weeks. Last month I asked anyone planning on attending to let me know if you would be there from 1:30-2:30 pm or 6:30-7:30 pm for planning purposes. As of this writing nobody has contacted me about this.

Looking ahead, in the April newsletter I will provide more information regarding Holy Week services. This year Evan will be hosting these services. Looking further ahead, I will be providing information on services that will be held in May for the teens who have been in Confirmation classes since September. As you see, things are getting busy in the Parish! Finally, look inside for a special message, page 6.

I am excited for plans that are coming together for this Parish as we hopefully soon can look at the Pandemic in a different light as God moves each one of us forward. Please take the time during this year's Lenten season to reflect on the past as well as renewing your faith in

the One who gave the ultimate sacrifice for each one of us.

A prayer for Lent:

This year, Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on March 2. During worship services that day, pastors in many Christian churches dip a finger in

ashes (often made by burning branches from the previous Palm Sunday) and make a cross on parishioners' foreheads. Why ashes? Traditionally, they're a sign of mourning, humiliation and penitence. Ashes also represent the frailty and temporary nature of human life ("You are dust, and to dust you shall return," Genesis 3:19). Christians are pained because our sins led to Jesus' death. With repentant hearts, we begin the season of Lent, knowing that it leads to Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. For Ash Wednesday — and throughout the 40 days of Lent — ponder this prayer from an Italian sacramentary, or liturgical book: "O God, you know how fragile is our human nature, wounded as it is by sin. Help your people to enter upon the Lenten journey strengthened by the power of your word, so that we may be victorious over the seduction of the Evil One and reach the paschal feast in the joy of the Holy Spirit."

An ancient prayer

Lord Jesus, think on me and purge away my sin. From earthborn passions set me free and make me pure within.

Lord Jesus, think on me, that when the flood is past, I may th' eternal brightness see and share your joy at last.

Wounded healers: "Nobody escapes being wounded," writes Henri Nouwen. "We all are wounded people, whether physically, emotionally, mentally or spiritually. The main question is not 'How can we hide our wounds?' so we don't have to be embarrassed, but 'How can we put our woundedness in the service of others?' When our wounds cease to be a source of shame, and become a source of healing, we have become wounded healers." He continues, "Jesus is God's wounded healer: through his wounds we are healed. Jesus' suffering and death brought joy and life. His humiliation brought glory; his rejection brought a community of love. As followers of Jesus, we can also allow our wounds to bring healing to others."

How might viewing Jesus as a wounded healer affect your relationship with him? What roles have wounds and healing played in your own faith life? How can you minister to other people from a place of brokenness?




