Due to deadlines, this is being written prior to myself and 11 others leaving for Red Bird Mission in Beverly, KY.

By nature, many of us are not patient when it comes to waiting. Some people, like myself, have had to learn this the hard way through the course of life. For this Parish, when I arrived here three years ago, there was a lot of talk about taking a Mission Trip to Red Bird Mission. Since this is a popular place for mission work to be done, the application for a chance to be selected to go there in 2020 had to be submitted in 2019. We were blessed to be selected to serve there in June 2020, which started the process on fund raisers, finding out how many wanted to join the trip and asking for donations.

As we all know, in March 2020 everyone's lives were changed by the COVID shutdown. The trip we were preparing for had to be canceled that year. Plans were made to go in June 2021, and early last year we were told that due to the pandemic's uncertainty at that time, we would not be able to go again. So, we were allowed to reserve our spot for June 26, 2022 arrival and departure on July 1, 2022.

That brings us to the present. What was once 16 people heading to Kentucky is now 12. But we are there as this reaches your mailbox! Needless to say, a lesson in what I have preached about (also known as In God's Time) has been lived by those who have wanted Red Bird Mission to be a place for this Parish to be God's hands for those who are less fortunate is finally reality.


I and the 11 others on the Mission Trip could not have done this without the help of so many. Monical's Pizza and Culver's were gracious enough to give us proceeds from sales at their locations. During the Christmas season of 2019 we went to homes, businesses and nursing homes singing Christmas carols to raise money for the trip. Throughout the past three years we have had so many in

the Parish and in the area provide cash donations, clothing donations and food donations. We took 14 cases of cereal and Malt-o-Meal that were donated along with other items for their food pantry. We brought baby clothing and other items for their baby pantry. I am probably forgetting other specifics, but between individual donations along with Evan's UWF, First Church's UMW, Sunshine Circle and Martha's Circle, there are a LOT of thank you's to spread around. As your Pastor, I am humbled by all the generosity that has been shown in the past three years.

July brings me to the start of my fourth year serving this Parish. I am so Blessed to continue to be a part of the Village of Bonfield and the surrounding area. Look inside this month's newsletter for information on in - person Vacation Bible School returning. Look inside for news on other events that will be happening in the coming months. 

That uninterested, distracted or unresponsive person may be nearer the Kingdom than we — or they realize." Kalas adds, "We dare not give up on anyone at any time — including ourselves."



A visit to the summit of Pikes Peak inspired Bates to write her most famous poem-hymn, "America the Beautiful."

Bates also realized that patriotism was an important part of America. She was grateful for heroes "who more than self their country loved and mercy more than life." She wanted all Americans to realize how God had shed his grace on them and had crowned what was good "with brotherhood from sea to shining sea."

Bates embodied the spirit of thankfulness to God for all she had experienced and been given.

The answer is evident in Jesus' own life and ministry, writes Michael Card in *Immanuel: Reflections* on the Life of Christ. In a twist on Julius Caesar's motto "Veni, vidi, vici" ("I came, I saw, I conquered"), "Jesus lived by the motto, 'I came, I saw, I surrendered," Card notes. "By living out this unorthodox pronouncement, Jesus demonstrated that what the world regards as power is really impotence. True victory is only through surrender."

During the 16th century, St. Ignatius of Loyola wrote this prayer of surrender that's still relevant today: "Take, O Lord, and receive my entire liberty, my memory, my understanding and my whole will. All that I am and all that I possess, Thou hast given me: I surrender it all to Thee to be disposed of according to Thy will. Give me only Thy love and Thy grace; with these I will be rich enough and will desire nothing more. Amen."


