As I write this article Fortitude is trying to figure out their next steps after being denied a zoning change for property they felt would fulfill the needs they want to provide. Our Parish has been involved in providing food for Fortitude as they reach out to those who need a meal. Some have even gone with them around Kankakee as they deliver food to those who need it.

I relate very well with the tireless work that those involved with Fortitude do. I personally know the struggles that those in need face. Having raised three children on my own, sometimes trying to figure out how to feed them and other times trying to figure out how to keep a roof over all of us. With God's help I was able to persevere and become stronger. Their mission at Fortitude is to build relationships with struggling individuals in Kankakee County by meeting them where they are, providing for physical, emotional, and spiritual needs, and connecting to community resources.

Because of the challenges I faced years ago and my belief in all they do, I will be matching what is raised this month through noisy change at both churches. So, your penny will actually be two pennies going to Fortitude.

If you know of anyone searching for a church to call home, please send them to either Evan or Grand Prairie and give us a try. We will show you the love of Jesus as we strive to continue to be Servants of the Lord!
