

The memory that sticks out to me was the only year that I didn't celebrate in Illinois.

When I was either 13 or 14 we loaded up the car, along with my grandma (on my dad's side) and drove to Utah to celebrate. The memory of driving through Wyoming an hour or two before the roads were closed due to heavy snow. My brother and I sleeping in our Aunt and Uncle's RV. And sharing Christmas with family that we didn't see often.

Have you notice something was missing in my youth during this time of year? Unless my memory is fading (and that is quite possible), I don't remember the joy that the Advent season brings. The anticipation of celebrating the birth of the one TRUE King. While I spent years in my youth attending Sunday School, I never lit a candle on the Advent wreath, and I never attended a candlelight service on Christmas Eve. Writer's note: My mom reads the newsletter, so if she reminds me that I did do either of these, I will let you know in next month's article.

When I re-dedicated my life to Jesus in March 2004, my thoughts on the Christmas season completely changed! While I still give gifts to family and friends, and enjoy seeing children's eyes light up while opening gifts, this season to me is more about the anticipation of celebrating the birth of a baby born of a virgin and her husband. God in the flesh, coming to Earth to save all of us by eventually taking away all of our sins. I went to my first candlelight service while in my 40's at my home church and cried when I tilted my candle to light it. The same thing happened when I led my first candlelight service as a Pastor.




I was truly surprised that my family planned a 90th birthday party for me and kept it a secret. Thank you to those who showered me with cards and gifts.

Your presence gave me joy to see many and from so many different states.




Thank-you



Don't miss out!: In his poem "The Inn That Missed Its Chance," Amos R. Wells writes from the perspective of the "fairly crazed" innkeeper who recalls Bethlehem becoming "a hive at swarming-time." Of the couple who requested shelter on what became Christmas Eve, the proprietor asks, "Could I know that they were so important?"

There was a sign, they say, a heavenly light resplendent; but I had no time for stars. And there were songs of angels in the air out on the hills; but how was I to hear amid the thousand clamors of an inn?

Your Light Has Come: In the introduction to his book For All God's Worth, theologian N.T. Wright says, "Christmas is God lighting a candle, and you don't light a candle in a room that's already full of sunlight. You light a candle in a room that's so murky that the candle, when lit, reveals just how bad things really are. The light shines in the darkness, says St. John, and the darkness has not overcome it."



For that reason, Wright explains, Christmas isn't a dream or a momentary escape but reality. And the same is true for Christianity. "Either Jesus is the Lord of the world and all reality makes sense in his life, or he is dangerously irrelevant to the problems and possibilities of today's world," he adds. "There is no middle ground. Either Jesus was, and is, the Word of God, or he, and the stories Christians tell about him, are lies."

Advent meanings: During Advent, which begins this year on December 3, many churches and families use wreaths to symbolize watchfulness and increasing joy as Christmas approaches. Colors for the candles vary, with some traditions using blue (for hope or creation) and others preferring purple (for royalty, humility or penitence).

The four candles that each represent a week in Advent also signify hope, peace, joy and love. (The third candle is often pink.) In the center is the white Christ candle, representing Jesus as the light of the world. That candle is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

The round, green Advent wreath has special meaning of its own. It symbolizes eternal life and the unending love of God, who sent his only Son to earth to die in our place.

Holiday humor: Much planning and preparation goes into worship during December. But that doesn't mean Christmas services and pageants are always picture-perfect. For anyone who's experienced holiday chaos (who hasn't?!), take comfort in knowing you're not alone.

Church leaders who shared stories with Outreach magazine describe an alarming number of Christmas candle vs. hair incidents. Here's what else has transpired:

- One pastor was sharing the Nativity story when he bumped the button on his singing Christmas tie, which didn't have a mute button. So congregants had to listen to the entire verse and chorus of "Jingle Bells."
- A child discovered a live mouse in his chocolatefilled gift bag on Christmas Eve. Although the creature jumped out and scurried out the door, worshipers saw it return for the next service.
- After flames were distributed for the candlelight service, a pastor said, "Now that we're all good and lit ...," causing laughter throughout the pews. Children tend to go off-script during Christmas plays, as evidenced by all the bloopers available online. (Check out the YouTube clip titled "Sheep, Mary tussle over baby Jesus in children's pageant gone hilariously awry.")



Moments of incarnation: The wonder of the infinite-personal God is displayed, more than anywhere else, in the Incarnation. Nothing can prepare us for the birth of God: a six-pound, four-ounce Jewish boy with dark brown curly hair born in the fall

or winter of 5 B.C. in a shepherd's cave on the side of a hill in the city of Bethlehem in the Roman province of Judea in western Asia.

It is so particular it staggers the imagination. God found a parking spot, a specific place and time where his love would touch our world. [Similarly,] prayer is a moment of incarnation — God with us. God involved in the details of my life.
