Jesus ascended to heaven, followed by the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the missionary task of the early church.

Many of us know this statement from years of studying the Bible. We have had the annual remembrance of The Last Supper, the trial, the crucifixion and the glorious Resurrection, also known as Holy Week. In my first year of being a Pastor I served a small church between Bloomington/Normal and Peoria, one of the members of that church asked me what happens after Easter. After pondering whether or not this was a test to see if I was qualified to be a Pastor, I gave them my answer with the statement above. If it WAS a test, I think I passed because their response was a simple thank you.

While the statement is a quick response to the question, there is a more detailed response that can be given. That response can be found in the Book of Acts. Many consider this book to be part 2 of Luke's Gospel, as he was the author of Acts. Part 1 shares the stories of Jesus and his ministry while on Earth, along with his account of we now refer to as Holy Week. Acts gives the account on what happened in the First Century. And that starts with the 40 days between the Resurrection day and the day of Pentecost, or the time when Jesus ascended to heaven until the day the Holy Spirit ascended.



Read at your own pace, and allow the content to soak into your mind. Hopefully it will enlighten you as you read.





Complete a Bible verse about spring by writing the word from each raindrop on the correct numbered line below.






Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

### What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- · Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help



### What you do:

- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!





VICTOR'S CROSS — Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left letters stand for *Jesus* and the top right



letters stand for *Christ* (the horizontal lines above them indicate that they are abbreviations). The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for *conqueror*.



**Superimposed love:** Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."

At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, *eclipse* means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes. Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness. Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of *appeared* here is *superimposed*, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."

Living discipleship: Christian theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who was hanged by the Nazis in April 1945, taught that Christianity and discipleship are intertwined. "Discipleship means adherence to Christ," he wrote in The Cost of Discipleship. "An abstract Christology, a doctrinal system, a general religious knowledge ... render discipleship superfluous ...." Bonhoeffer continued, "With an abstract idea, it is possible to enter into a relation of formal knowledge, to become enthusiastic about it, and perhaps even to put it into practice; but it can never be followed in personal obedience. Christianity without the living Christ is inevitably Christianity without discipleship, and Christianity without discipleship is always Christianity without Christ."
